## IPCC TRUST FUND PROGRAMME AND BUDGET

## INTRODUCTION

1. The document provides an overview of the status of income and expenditure of the IPCC Trust Fund as at 30 September 2023. It also highlights the level of budget allotments required to carry out the anticipated activities of the work programme at the beginning of the seventh assessment cycle with respect to the years from 2024-2026. The document serves to provide all the necessary information needed for the Panel to make an informed decision with regard to the approval of the programme and budget of the IPCC Trust Fund for 2023 and proposed for 2024 at its $60^{\text {th }}$ Session.
2. Decisions IPCC-LIVII-4 on the IPCC Trust Fund Programme and Budget contained in Annex 1 to the Report of the $57^{\text {th }}$ Session of the IPCC (IPCC-57) include the approved revised 2022 and proposed 2023 budgets, a forecast 2024 budget and an indicative budget for 2025. Annex 10 to this document provides the revised 2023 budget for consideration by the $60^{\text {th }}$ Session of the IPCC (IPCC60), Annex 11 contains a proposed budget for 2024 for consideration by IPCC-60. Annex 12 provides the forecast 2025 budget and Annex 13 contains the indicative budget for 2026. Annexes 1 through 13 relate to the IPCC Trust Fund only. It should be noted that there are other resources available to the IPCC, notably support services provided by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), including the provision of the two senior posts in the IPCC Secretariat, generous contributions by the Governments of China, France, Japan, Malaysia, The Netherlands, Pakistan, Singapore and the United States of America which are supporting Technical Support Units (TSUs), support from all those Governments and Organizations which host IPCC meetings and events and make experts available to the IPCC and voluntary "inkind" contributions from the Governments of Germany, United Kingdom and United States of America to support the operation of the IPCC Data Distribution Centre.
3. The generous in-kind contribution made by the Government of Türkiye for the organization of the $60^{\text {th }}$ Session of the IPCC is acknowledged.
4. This budget document contains two parts. Part A presents the status of income and expenditure for the Trust Fund. Part B includes the revised 2023 and proposed 2024 budgets, the forecast 2025 budget and the indicative 2026 budget.

## PART A - INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

5. Annex 1 provides a summary of income and expenditure in 2023 as at 30 September 2023. Annex 2 shows a list of Member Governments and Organizations that have made a financial contribution to the Trust Fund as of 30 September 2023.
6. Annex 3 provides an update as at 30 September 2023 of the annual rate of voluntary cash contributions to the IPCC Trust Fund since its inception from Member Governments, the European Union, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO). Annex 4 presents the monthly breakdown of contributions received in 2023 as at 30 September 2023. The interim statement of comparison of budget and actual amount as at 30 September 2023 is presented in Annex 5. A list of in-kind contributions/activities for the period January to September 2023 is attached as Annex 6.

## PART B: BUDGETS

7. The proposals for the IPCC budgets for 2023, 2024, 2025 and 2026 are using the same standard costs as were used in the preparation of the 2023 budget approved at the $57^{\text {th }}$ Session of the IPCC and the forecast 2024 budget that was noted at the $57^{\text {th }}$ Session of the IPCC.
8. The standard costs for the budget preparation are as follows: the budgetary requirement for a Panel session has been established at CHF 70,000 per day. The budgetary requirement for sessions of the IPCC Bureau has been established at CHF 30,000 per day. The established rate for travel costs is CHF 4,000 per trip and 17 per cent of total travel costs are to be utilized to cover meeting costs. Annex 7 provides a breakdown of costs for the budget line for the Secretariat. Annex 8 provides a breakdown of costs for the budget line on Communications.
9. Annex 9 provides an overview of the IPCC Trust Fund budget, by category, from 2023-2026.
10. All activities, with budgetary implications, for the Working Groups and the Task Force on National Greenhouse Gas Inventories have been reflected as adjustments to the budget tables contained in Annexes 10 through 13. These budgetary implications could be further adjusted based on the final work programme for the Seventh Assessment cycle to be confirmed at the $60^{\text {th }}$ Session of the IPCC.
11. Annex 10 contains the revised 2023 budget. Changes to the budget approved by IPCC-57 include the following:

## Governing Bodies

- Transfer of budget line "IPCC-60" to 2024; decrease of CHF 760,000;
- Adjustment in number of journeys for budget line "TFB", decrease of CHF 42,120.


## Lead Author, Scoping, Expert Meetings and Workshops

- Transfer of budget line "Scoping Meeting (SR Cities)" to 2024, decrease of CHF 234,000;
- Transfer of budget line "Expert Meeting on Gender, Inclusivity and Diversity" to 2024, decrease of CHF 93,600;
- Transfer of budget line "TFI Scoping Meeting on Short-lived Climate Forcers" to 2024; decrease of CHF 187,200;
- Adjustment to amount for budget line "TFI Expert Meeting - Contingency", decrease of CHF 117,000.


## Other Expenditure

- Adjustment in amount for budget line "Publications/Translations", decrease of CHF 200,000;
- Adjustment in amount for budget lines "Communication I", decrease of CHF 378,000.

12. Annex 11 contains the proposed budget for the year 2024. The proposed 2024 budget is based on the assumption that two Plenary Sessions will be held in 2024 (IPCC-60 and IPCC-61) and both sessions will be held in-person. Two Bureaux Sessions are planned to be held in 2024. Changes to the 2024 budget noted by IPCC-57 include the following:

## Governing Bodies

- Renaming of budget line "IPCC-61" to "IPCC-60";
- Renaming of budget line "IPCC-62" to "IPCC-61";
- Adjustment in number of journeys for budget line "Bureau", decrease of CHF 40,000;
- Adjustment in number of meetings and journeys for budget line "TFB", increase of CHF 51,480.


## Lead Author, Scoping, Expert Meetings and Workshops

- Addition of budget line "Scoping Meeting (SR Cities)", increase of CHF 234,000;
- Addition of budget line "Expert Meeting on Gender, Inclusivity and Diversity", increase of CHF 93,600;
- Adjustment in number of journeys for budget line "EFDB Editorial Board", decrease of CHF 98,280;
- Adjustment in number of journeys for budget line "EFDB Data meeting", decrease of CHF 46,800;
- Addition of budget line "TFI Scoping Meeting on Short-lived Climate Forcers", increase of CHF 205,920;
- Transfer of budget line "TFI - Short-lived Climate Forcers LAM2", decrease of CHF 468,000;
- Addition of budget line "Workshop on IPCC Inventory Software", increase of CHF 645,840.


## Other Expenditure

- Adjustment in amount of budget line "2006 GL software"; increase of CHF 30,000;
- Adjustment in amount of budget line "Publications/Translations"; increase of CHF 200,000;
- Adjustment in amount of budget line "Communication I", decrease of CHF 157,200.
