Communications and Outreach Activities

This report on IPCC's media, outreach and other communication activities covers the period since the Sixty-first Session of the IPCC (IPCC-61) held in Sofia from 27 July to 02 August 2024.

During this period (July 2024 to January 2025), the IPCC communications and outreach activities focused primarily on building the stronger visibility of the Seventh Assessment Report (AR7) Bureau members, preparations and communications work around the 29th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP29) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in Baku, Azerbaijan in November 2024, the Scoping Meeting for the Seventh Assessment Report (AR7), and overall coordination, development and delivery of media and public outreach activities since the last Progress Report. Media relations work dealt with a steady flow of incoming queries and interview requests. In addition, the team has been managing outreach engagement and has been instrumental in identifying and supporting IPCC speakers at events and conferences.

The team's work in January 2025 focused on forward planning and preparations and coordination of potential media and outreach engagements in support of the upcoming IPCC-62 and First Lead Author (LAM1) meetings for the Special Report on Climate Change and Cities, and the Methodology Report on Short-lived Climate Forcers.

In addition to this Progress Report to the Plenary, the Communications and Outreach team also provided regular monthly reports to the IPCC Executive Committee and the Progress Report to the Bureau in December 2024.

1. Media Relations

Media interest during this period was dominated by queries relating to the IPCC-61 Plenary session and its relevance for delivering the agreed set of reports for Seventh Assessment Reports (AR7) as well as to expectations and outcomes of COP29. Other media queries related the feasibility of the 1.5°C goal, assessed scenarios and global warming were prompted mainly by regular releases of information by several meteo services about a streak of consecutive, record-breaking monthly high temperatures during 2024.

On the margins of the IPCC-61 in Sofia, the team organized several media engagements with key national outlets in Bulgaria, including three strategically placed long-format interviews given by the Chair to the national Nova TV, the influential weekly magazine "Capital" and the Bulgarian News Agency BTA in Sofia, ahead of the IPCC Plenary, as well as interviews for one of the IPCC Vice-Chairs with the leading Bulgarian podcast programme and the visiting Euronews TV crew. Ahead of the IPCC-61, a media advisory was issued covering the opening ceremony and providing links to text and visual assets for media use, while following the closure of the IPCC-61, a press release was issued covering the Panel's key decisions.

During autumn 2024, most incoming media queries focused on a series of extreme weather events, such as hurricanes and recent record floods in Eastern and Central Europe, as well as on requests for interviews with the Chair and other Bureau members in the lead-up to COP29 and fact-checking.

2. Outreach

During this reporting period, members of the IPCC Bureau engaged in various events, panel discussions, and conferences aimed at promoting involvement in the IPCC's seventh assessment cycle. They presented the role of the IPCC and shared scientific findings related to climate change, focusing on impacts, adaptation, and mitigation.

The key outreach highlights of this period include the outreach during IPCC-61 in Sofia, Bulgaria, the IPCC's high-profile participation at COP29, which took place in Baku, Azerbaijan, from 11 to 22 November, the IPCC Secretary's participation at the Climate Week in New York and the participation of several Bureau members in the Innovate4Cities Conference held in Montreal, Canada.

On the margins of the IPCC-61 in Sofia the team coordinated and facilitated several outreach activities. The two strategic outreach engagements included the Chair's keynote address to the participants of the International Scientific Conference on Climate Risks in the Black Sea region, organised by the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences and the keynote address by a Working Group III (WGIII) Vice-Chair at the International Conference Climate policies as an opportunity for investment in urban development organised by the Bulgarian government.

Another critical outreach workflow during this period related to COP29 where the IPCC took part in seven mandated events, several UNFCCC side events, and hosted a comprehensive program of its own and participatory events at the joint WMO/IPCC/Meri Foundation "Science for Climate Action" pavilion. Overall, the IPCC was involved in organizing or participating in more than 40 events during COP29.

COP29 key highlights included the Chair's address at the opening of the High-Level Segment for Heads of State and Government during the World Leaders Climate Action Summit, supported by a specially produced, tailored video projection. The Chair also addressed the opening of the Earth Information Day event and the 2024 Annual High-Level Ministerial Round Table on pre-2030 Ambition. The IPCC Secretary made a statement during the opening plenary of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA).

IPCC Vice-Chairs participated in the High-Level Roundtable on Nature, Health, and Agriculture in Cities, as well as the LCIPP Annual Youth Round Table – Part II: Dialogue with Parties and other stakeholders. Other mandated events included the Working Group II Co-Chair's participation in the Nairobi Work Programme event on monitoring, evaluation, and learning systems for adaptation and support, including transformational adaptation, and at the High-Level Event of the Leaders' Summit entitled "Adverse Impacts of Climate Change on the Decline of Water Basins."

The IPCC's side event in the UNFCCC official program focused on the plans for the Panel's work during the seventh assessment cycle and was extremely well attended and received. It also provided updates on the progress of the upcoming Special Report on Climate Change and Cities and the Methodology Report on Short-Lived Climate Forcers. This event also included discussions on knowledge gaps from the perspectives of the IPCC's three Working Groups.

The IPCC, WMO, and MERI Foundation organized a series of events at the joint "Science for Climate Action" pavilion. The pavilion aimed to serve as a toolbox for delegates and a forum for gathering input to inform the AR7 planning. IPCC events at the pavilion were forward-looking and closely aligned with the thematic days of COP to effectively support delegations and negotiators.

While some IPCC events were conducted by individual Working Groups or the Task Force on National Greenhouse Gas Inventory (TFI), approximately half of them were joint efforts involving two or more Working Groups and the TFI. During the first week of COP29, the IPCC events focused on showcasing the IPCC's work and scientific elements related to AR7. The second week opened up to events based on third-party proposals of strategic interest to the IPCC.

Attendance at the IPCC events at the pavilion was high, with large in-person audiences. Additionally, the average number of online viewers for IPCC's live streams exceeded 1,000, peaking at over 1,500 and reaching a low of more than 850 viewers.

3. Communications (and Outreach) Action Team

The AR7 Communications and Outreach Action Team (COAT), a subsidiary body of the IPCC Executive Committee, held its inaugural AR7 session in July 2024. The AR7 COAT is chaired by the IPCC Chair. With strategic lead from the Executive Committee, the COAT work during this period has been focused on conceptualisation, planning and coordination of IPCC public-facing activities at COP29.

Based on identified training needs, the first communications and media training for the IPCC Bureau Members was held in virtual format on 4 November, ahead of the COP29. More than 20 Bureau Members attended this virtual training session.


4. IPCC Newsletter

Two issues of the quarterly newsletter have been issued since the previous progress report. Issue 22 was released in October 2024 (covering the third quarter of 2024) and Issue 23 in January 2025 (covering IPCC activities in the last quarter of 2024). The next issue covering January to March 2025 will be in early April. The IPCC Newsletter serves as an internal communication tool to update the Focal Points from governments and observer organizations on IPCC activities in between Sessions.

5. Impact and Statistics

5.1 IPCC Media Coverage

The IPCC was mentioned over 1,600 (1,637) times from 1 July to 31 December 2024, in the top-tier 100+ news sources, as monitored by Meltwater. Comparatively, during the same period in 2023, IPCC was mentioned 3,059 times in the top-tier media. At that time the coverage was dominated by the release of the AR6 Synthesis Report and its presentations at the UNFCCC STBSTA and COP28, as well as by the IPCC elections for the new Bureaus in July 2023.

5.2 IPCC Website Statistics

From July 2024 to the time of writing of this report in mid-January 2025, the IPCC website recorded just over two million users compared to 1.9 million during the same time between 2023 and early 2024.

Of the two million users in the current reporting period, 912,096 came from organic searches, 746,042 were direct visits to the website, 264,217 were from referral sites, and 39,683 were from organic social media links.

5.3 IPCC Social Media Statistics

Since the last Progress Report to the Panel at its 61st Session, IPCC social media platforms have been focused on raising awareness about IPCC's role, key AR7 activities, including Plenary sessions, media and outreach efforts, IPCC AR6 findings and the work plan for the seventh cycle. Engaging content has been created to reach and connect broader sections of audiences with IPCC media and outreach assets and activities, information about the IPCC, tailored posts in support of important moments such as UN International Days and reposting relevant content from the parent and other organisations. The objectives were to inform, engage, and drive traffic to the IPCC's main website and microsites hosting IPCC reports. The content was created solely within the IPCC Secretariat with additional support from Working Group communications.

One of the main highlights during this period was amplifying the call for nominations of authors for the Special Report on Climate Change and Cities and the Methodology Report on Short-lived Climate Forcers. Ten short videos were produced from interviews with Bureau Members at the 61st Session of the IPCC held in Sofia, Bulgaria. Videos were produced in three languages: English, French and Spanish. Throughout August, they were viewed over 120,000 times on X (formerly known as Twitter) and generated nearly 5,000 follow-ups to the page hosting the call for nominations of authors for the Special Report on Climate Change and Cities call and more than 800 visits from the posts to the page with the call for nomination of authors for the Methodology Report on Short-Lived Climate Forcers.

IPCC's participation at COP is always a major highlight on IPCC's social media calendar. COP29 provided rich content for IPCC to communicate its work and engage audiences globally. For COP29, as with all earlier COPs, tailored visual assets for all social media platforms were prepared for all IPCC activities


A total of 236 posts were released in the lead-up and during COP29 across all IPCC social platforms. Overall, the post impressions from 10 October to 20 November more than doubled – they were up to 1,493,629 from 623,040 impressions between mid-September and mid-October.

A specially tailored video to accompany the IPCC Chair's speech at the opening of the High-Level Segment of the World Leaders Climate Action Summit was also produced.

With regards to growth, IPCC Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn accounts have registered a continuing growth of audiences during this reporting period. The number of followers on Facebook reached 528,000, on Instagram 194,000 and on LinkedIn just over 295,000 followers.

IPCC's "X" (formerly known as Twitter) account has been hovering at just under 420,000 followers. In November, the account registered a slight decrease in the number of followers.

As of mid-January 2025, the total number of followers across all IPCC social media platforms exceeded 1.425 million.
