IPCC TRUST FUND PROGRAMME AND BUDGET

INTRODUCTION

1. The document provides an overview of the status of income and expenditure of the IPCC Trust Fund as of 30 June 2025. It also highlights the level of budget allotments required to carry out the anticipated activities of the work programme during the seventh assessment cycle with respect to the years from 2025-2028. The document serves to provide all the necessary information needed for the Panel to make an informed decision with regard to the approval of the programme and budget of the IPCC Trust Fund for 2025 revised and proposed for 2026 at its 63rd Session. **The scope of this document and its Annexes 1-15 is limited to the IPCC General Trust Fund and does not extend to the IPCC Scholarship Programme Trust Fund.**

2. Decisions *IPCC-LXII-7* on the IPCC Trust Fund Programme and Budget contained in the [Decisions adopted by the Panel](#) at the Sixty-Second Session of the IPCC (IPCC-62) include the approved revised 2024 and approved proposed 2025 budgets, the forecast 2026 budget and the indicative 2027 budget. **Annex 10** to this document provides the revised 2025 budget for consideration by the 63rd Session of the IPCC (IPCC-63). **Annex 11** contains the proposed 2026 budget for consideration by IPCC-63. **Annex 12** provides the forecast 2027 budget and **Annex 13** contains the indicative 2028 budget. It should be noted that there are other resources available to the IPCC, notably support services provided by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), including the provision of the two senior posts in the IPCC Secretariat, generous contributions by the Governments of Australia, China, France, Germany, Japan, Malaysia, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Pakistan, Singapore, and the United States of America which are supporting Technical Support Units (TSUs), support from all those member countries and Organizations which host IPCC meetings and events and make experts available to the IPCC, and voluntary “in-kind” contributions from the Governments of Germany, Spain, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America to support the operation of the IPCC Data Distribution Centre.

3. The generous in-kind contribution made by the Government of the Republic of Peru for the organization of the 63rd Session of the IPCC is acknowledged.

4. This budget document contains two parts. Part A presents the status of income and expenditure for the Trust Fund. Part B includes the revised 2025 and proposed 2026 budgets, the forecast 2027 budget and the indicative 2028 budget.

PART A – INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

5. **Annex 1** provides a summary of income and expenditure for 2025 as of 30 June 2025. **Annex 2** shows a list of member countries and Organizations that have made a financial contribution to the Trust Fund as of 30 June 2025.

6. **Annex 3** provides an update as of 30 June 2025 on the annual voluntary cash contributions to the IPCC Trust Fund since its inception from member countries, the European Union, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO). **Annex 4** presents the monthly breakdown of contributions received in 2025 as of 30 June 2025. The interim statement of comparison of budget and actual amounts as of 30 June 2025 is presented in **Annex 5**. A list of in-kind contributions/activities for the period January to June 2025 is attached as **Annex 6**.

PART B – BUDGETS

7. The proposals for the IPCC budgets for 2025, 2026, 2027 and 2028 are using the same standard costs as were used in the preparation of the 2025 budget approved at the 62nd Session of the IPCC and the forecast 2026 budget that was noted at the 62nd Session of the IPCC.

8. The standard costs for the budget preparation are as follows: the budgetary requirement for a Panel session has been established at CHF 70,000 per day. The budgetary requirement for sessions of the IPCC Bureau has been established at CHF 30,000 per day. The established rate for travel costs is CHF 4,000 per journey. Meeting costs, under 'Other Expenditure' serve as a contingency and are derived from 17% of total travel costs. **Annex 7** provides a breakdown of costs for the IPCC Secretariat budget line. **Annex 8** provides a breakdown of costs for the budget line on Communication I.

9. **Annex 9** provides an overview of the IPCC Trust Fund budget, by category, from 2025-2028.

10. All activities, with budgetary implications, for the Working Groups and the Task Force on National Greenhouse Gas Inventories have been reflected in the budget tables contained in Annexes 10 through 13. These budgetary implications could be adjusted based on the final work programme for the Seventh Assessment cycle to be confirmed at the 63rd Session of the IPCC.

11. **Annex 10** contains the revised 2025 budget. Changes to the budget approved by IPCC-62 include the following:

- Renaming of purpose "Standard plenary business, Programme and budget" for budget line "IPCC- 63, 4 days" to "AR7 workplan & MR CDR outline, Programme and budget";

Lead Author, Scoping, Expert Meetings and Workshops

- Decrease in number of journeys for budget line "WG I AR7 LAM 1" from 105 to 90, decrease of CHF 70,200;
- Transfer of budget line "Chair - Workshop - Engaging Diverse Knowledge Systems" to 2026, decrease of CHF 117,000;
- Transfer of budget line "Chair - Workshop - Methods of Assessment" to 2026, decrease of CHF 117,000;
- Renaming of budget line "GAT - Expert Meeting - Diversity, Equity and Inclusivity" to "GAT - Expert Meeting - Gender, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusivity (GDEI)",
- Transfer of budget line "Chair - Expert Meeting - Science of Communicating Science" to 2026, decrease of CHF 93,600;
- Deletion of budget line "EFDB Editorial Board & Data Meeting", decrease of CHF 98,280;
- Transfer of budget line "TFI - Science Meeting - CDR Methodology Report" to 2026, decrease of CHF 70,200;
- Deletion of budget line "TFI - Expert Meeting", decrease of CHF 187,200;

Other Expenditure

- Adjustment in amount for budget line "Communication I", decrease of CHF 60,400;
- Transfer of budget line "Science Editors" to 2026, decrease of CHF 95,194;
- Addition of budget line "WG III TSU (Malaysia)" related to earmarked contributions from Australia (2025), New Zealand (2025 & 2024), Norway (2025 & 2024), Sweden (2025) and the United States of America (2024 & 2023), increase of CHF 904,508;
- Addition of budget line "TFI - SLCF Methodology Report" related to an earmarked contribution from Norway (2021), increase of CHF 17,315;

12. **Annex 11** contains the proposed budget for the year 2026. The proposed 2026 budget is based on the assumption that two Plenary Sessions will be held in 2026 (IPCC-64 and IPCC-65)

and both sessions will be held in-person. Two Bureau Sessions are planned to be held in 2026. Changes to the 2026 budget, which was noted by IPCC-62, include the following:

Lead Author, Scoping, Expert Meetings and Workshops

- Decrease in number of journeys for budget line “WG I AR7 LAM 2 and LAM 3” from 210 to 195, decrease of CHF 70,200;
- Addition of budget line “SR Cities SPM Drafting Meeting I”, increase of CHF 70,200;
- Transfer of budget line “Chair - Workshop - Engaging Diverse Knowledge Systems” from 2025, increase of CHF 117,000;
- Transfer of budget line “Chair - Workshop - Methods of Assessment” from 2025, increase of CHF 117,000;
- Transfer of budget line “Chair - Expert Meeting - Science of Communicating Science” from 2025, increase of CHF 93,600;
- Decrease in number of journeys for budget line “EFDB Editorial Board & Data Meeting” from 21 to 9, decrease of CHF 56,160;
- Increase in number of journeys from 70 to 76 for budget line “TFI - CDR Methodology Report LAM 1”, increase of CHF 28,080;
- Addition of budget line “TFI – CDR Methodology Report LAM 2”, increase of CHF 355,680;
- Renaming of budget line “TFI - SLCF/CDR Methodology Reports - LAM 3” to “TFI - SLCF Methodology Report LAM 3”, decrease in number of journeys from 162 to 86 and transfer of budget line “TFI - CDR Methodology Report LAM 3” to 2027, decrease of CHF 355,680;
- Correction of DC/EIT support calculation for budget line “TFI - Science Meeting - SLCF Methodology Report” using the correct number of 15 journeys instead of 152 journeys, decrease of CHF 641,160;
- Transfer of budget line “TFI - Science meeting - CDR Methodology Report” from 2025, increase of CHF 70,200;

Other Expenditure

- Adjustment in amount for budget line “Communication I”, increase of CHF 58,000;
- Adjustment in amount for budget line “TG-Data”, decrease of CHF 130,000;
- Adjustment in amount for budget line “Science Editors” and renaming of purpose from “Technical editing services” to “Technical editing services (5 languages)”, increase of CHF 611,882;
- Adjustment in amount for budget line “Secretariat” related to a portion of administrative support services (WMO), moving from in-kind contribution from WMO to funding by the IPCC Trust Fund, increase of CHF 300,000;

Terms of Reference of the Financial Task Team⁴

Financial Task Team

6. The Panel should establish for every assessment cycle a Financial Task Team (FiTT) to undertake tasks including reviewing income and expenditures, assisting in preparing the budget proposals and developing other recommendations related to finance for consideration by the Panel.

7. The Financial Task Team should be co-chaired by two government representatives represented on the IPCC Bureau: one from a developed country and one from either a developing country or a country with economy in transition. While being open-ended, the Financial Task Team would have a core membership of four government representatives from countries represented on the Bureau. The co-chairs and core members of the Financial Task Team would be selected by the Bureau.
