PROGRESS REPORTS

Report by the IPCC Chair and Vice Chairs

This report is organised according to the three main themes identified by the Chair for AR7: interdisciplinarity (including other science-related activities); inclusivity; and policy relevance. It covers the period from 1st October 2025 to 28th February 2026.

There is a short narrative briefing for each theme, followed by lists of Chair and Vice-Chairs' activities as in previous reports to the Plenary.

After a long absence for health reasons (since June 2025), IPCC Vice-Chair Ramón Pichs-Madruga is now recovering and again participating in IPCC events, for the moment mainly in virtual mode.

Interdisciplinarity and science-related activities

Internal to the IPCC

Much of the responsibility for these lies with the Working Groups and their Bureaux. Since the last Plenary Meeting, the Working Groups have collaborated to:

- a) organise the third Lead Author Meeting (LAM 3) for the Special Report on Climate Change and Cities (January 2026, Oslo);
- b) organise the joint first Lead Author Meeting (LAM 1) for the three reports of the Working Groups (December 2025, Paris).

The Chair and Vice-Chair Diana Ürge-Vorsatz attended the LAM 3, participating in an SPM-related session and cross-cutting Breakout Groups. The Chair and Vice-Chairs Ladislaus Chang'a, Ramón Pichs-Madruga and Diana Ürge-Vorsatz participated in LAM 1, focusing on cross-cutting topics such as scenarios.

The Chair is invited to attend regular Co-Chairs' meetings and has actively supported collaborative activities.

External to the IPCC

The Chair partially attended the 12th Plenary session of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) in Manchester, United Kingdom. On 3 February 2026, he made a short presentation to the first plenary session about progress within the IPCC seventh assessment cycle and scientific links between IPBES and the IPCC.

Inclusivity

The IPCC Chair and his team have been working on **enabling wide access to literature for all authors** participating in the seventh assessment cycle. The American Geophysical Union and the American Meteorological Society have agreed to offer access, as have Elsevier, Springer Nature and John Wiley & Sons. These publishing houses together accounted for approximately 65% of the citations in Sixth Assessment Report. Practicalities are being finalised with the publishers, and authors should soon be able to access these publishers' journals. Efforts are continuing to secure participation from further publishers.

Two co-located IPCC Workshops (*Engaging Diverse Knowledge Systems and Methods of Assessment*) have been organised and delivered by the Chair's Office with support from the Working Group Technical Support Units. Participants were selected with the assistance of the Scientific Steering Committee (SSC), with invitations sent through late October and November 2025. The SSC then turned its attention to meeting design and organisation.

The two workshops, held from 10 to 12 February 2026, were hosted by the University of Reading, with support from the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and in collaboration with the UK Met Office. We are grateful to all these organisations for their support.

A total of 43 people participated in the *Workshop on Engaging Diverse Knowledge Systems*, including holders of Indigenous Knowledge and practitioner representatives. This meeting resulted in a set of specific recommendations for the IPCC and others. A total of 41 people participated in the *Workshop on Methods of Assessment*, including artificial intelligence (AI) experts from outside the climate domain and experts in systematic review and *ex-post* evaluations from related scientific fields, including health. The outputs of this meeting are more preliminary in nature, but a firm conclusion was that there was a need for some form of standing group within the IPCC to monitor AI developments and develop guidance on the use (and mis-use) of AI. A number of people also attended both workshops' plenaries remotely.

There was a degree of cross-workshop engagement through joint plenaries and focused "visits" by experts from one workshop to another to address issues such as the assessment of grey literature or the application of data sovereignty principles in respect of Indigenous Knowledge. The reports of each workshop, which will be sent to all participants for comment, is anticipated to be available ahead of the 71st Session of the Bureau and the 65th Session of the Panel.

Resources to support developing country chapter scientists during the seventh assessment cycle have been secured from the Wellcome Trust, through efforts led mainly by WG II. Some Chapter Scientists have now participated in the joint Working Group LAM 1 and LAMs for the Special Report on Climate Change and Cities.

A variety of other initiatives are under way, many falling within the remit of the Working Groups. Diversity and inclusion have been actively considered in selecting participants in Expert Meetings and Workshops, and in author selection. Participation statistics reported elsewhere show considerable progress in terms of improving the balance of participation regarding gender, developed/developing countries as well as cross-regional and intra-regional aspects.

The Chair and all members of his team participated in the training for IPCC Bureau members on Gender, Diversity, Equity and Inclusivity (GDEI) by *EY Switzerland* in Geneva on 27th February 2026.

Policy relevance

Vice-Chairs Ladislaus Chang'a and Diana Ürge-Vorsatz travelled to Belem for COP 30 in November, while the Chair participated virtually in the Opening Ceremony, the SBSTA Research Dialogue and the Third High-level Ministerial Dialogue on Climate Finance. The Chair and Vice-Chairs also participated in a number of events in the IPCC-WMO-MERI Science for Action Pavilion.

During the second week in December, the Chair attended the United Nations Environment Programme Assembly (UNEA 7) in Nairobi. He contributed to the High-level Dialogue "Keeping the Promise", a panel discussion on Science and Policy, and had several bilateral meetings with representatives, including ministers, of different organisations and countries.

IPCC Bureau members and scientists associated with the IPCC have continued to communicate findings to policymakers and stakeholders both internationally and at national and regional levels. Examples of engagement include contributions by the Chair to the Asia-Pacific Climate Change Forum, the PreCOP Business Summit, and IPBES Plenary.
