
Urban Planning System in Thailand Classified into Two Categories and Five Levels

The Provincial Policy Plan




Land Use Plans

The National Spatial Policy Plan: Land use guideline for sustainable future of the country


The National Policy Plan


- The National Plan a large-scale strategic development framework to achieve the national strategy. In creating stability, wealthy and sustainability

The National POLICY board approves to announce in the Royal Thai Government Gazette.


























Disasters and Disaster Risk Areas
